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1. Welcome Golfers.

Dear Golfers:

Welcome to the 2010 Stefanides Invitational Golf Tournament. We really want you to enjoy your visit to Myrtle Beach, while playing some golf, relaxing, and generally laughing a lot. Hopefully, you'll enjoy time with old friends, and make some new ones too. This year, we are playing some very nice courses, including one that some would rate as an "A" course in the form of Barefoot Norman. We're also very hopeful that this, our second year of playing in March, is as nice weather-wise as it was last year.

You should know that this event started in 1978 as a venture of three Stefanides brothers (Jon, Gil, & Gary), a brother-in-law (Jim Sullivan), a father (Jon), and a few close friends. For the first few years, the group consisted of eight brave golfers from the Northeast who could wait no longer to hit the links. So, they ventured to Myrtle Beach in one Chevy Suburban truck with a U-haul to play several rounds of golf and to get away from the cold weather and the pressures of work. The tournament has grown and has invited many other golfers, added an additional day of golf. Now, the founders' children and their friends make up a large part of this event.

As you may know, our long-standing and highly-esteemed Tournament Director - Gil Stefanides - retired this past year. In honor of Gil's many, many years of service to the tournament, we are renaming the past "Tournament Director's Award" as the "Gil Stefanides Tournament Director's Award." As in the past, this award was given to the golfer who is most helpful and/or (pleasantly) sociable during the tournament.

Your new tournament leadership team consists of Jason Stefanides - Tournament Director, Dave Buttner - Assistant Director for Finance / Scoring / Rulings, as well as Jimmy Sullivan - Assistant Director for Facilities. We hope to uphold the high standards set by Gil Stefanides, and we hope that you all appreciate Gil's past efforts as much as we do. Thanks Gil!

Please note that because of his recent illness, Jason will not be attending this year's tournament. Thus, Dave Buttner is serving as the Acting Tournament Director until Jason returns in 2011. We'd also like to share the news that Jason is very nicely on the mend.

We should point out that the tournament format remains essentially unchanged. We've made a few rule changes and reformatted a few documents, but this essentially this is the same great tournament that was designed and refined over the years by the founders.

Minor rule changes this year include selecting Day 3 Captains based upon the sum of their Day 1 and 2 gross scores. The day 3 draft also starts off with the lowest rated captain picking first, and the highest picking last. We have also simplified Day 3 Captain's Choice by just letting teams play from the same tee position throughout the round. There's a new documented rule for team play involving 3-somes. A final noteworthy change involves when we are teeing off from both the front and back tees, the Stefanides Invitation Golf Management System (SIGMS) will use a numerical randomizer to decide who goes to what side. Remember, our golfing competition is designed to be fun, present a variety of golf challenges, and do so in a fashion that gives virtually everybody a chance to be in the hunt for the championship.

Another change this year is that we have renamed the Tournament Champion's Prize the "Ed Spray Memorial Championship Award." Besides Ed being the only golfer to have a hole-in-one during the tournament, he was a great guy. As many of you know, Ed passed away just days before the start of the 2009 tournament. We believe it most appropriate to recognize Ed's contribution as a tournament contestant over the course of many years. Ed came to Myrtle Beach to hang with his buddies and play some golf. We think that Ed's friendly, kind, and relaxed attitude throughout many past tournaments sets a social standard that should be memorialized. Thanks Ed. We miss you!

Life is way too short. So, let's enjoy the golf, the socializing, and the camaraderie!

Resort Check-In Check-List:

At check-in, you should receive the following items. If you do not, please contact the front desk. If you are unsuccessful in solving any issues, then please contact Jimmy Sullivan, Assistant Director of Facilities (mobile phone 843-685-0543).

- ✓ Room key.
- ✓ Resort map.
- ✓ 4 complimentary tickets to Tena's Restaurant for breakfast. Each morning, free complimentary breakfast buffet is available to our group. Please remember to bring a ticket each day. They will not let you enter the restaurant without it.
- ✓ 1 complimentary ticket to the Wednesday evening Oyster Roast. This event is held from 500p - 600p. Please bring your ticket if you go to this event. Frankly, if you are golfing in the practice round, you may miss this. *See "3. Overall Event Schedule."*
- ✓ 1 complimentary ticket for a free dinner at Three Steps Down Grille & Tavern located at the Sea Mist Resort.
- ✓ The balance you pay at check-in should be approximately \$425. If you are staying an extra night, this balance due may have been different. If you paid a larger deposit, there may also be a difference. Please note that you will need to settle your account with a credit card or cash – no personal checks. Remember that out of the \$140 deposit, \$20 goes to the tournament prize fund and \$20 is for the Friday night group dinner at Crabby Mike's. Thus, the resort received \$100 toward your account. We've reduced the original package price with some group discount funds we ultimately received.

3. Overall Event Schedule.

DAY 0 - Wednesday, March 17, 2010 – Check in Day > Practice Round at River Oaks Plantation > Complimentary Oyster Roast at Hotel (optional) OR Beers at Ron Jon's (optional).

All Day: Golfers arriving into Myrtle Beach area. If you are in need of transfer from the airport to the resort, taxi fare should be less than \$15, even with tip. If you need to get from the airport to the practice round golf course, please contact Jimmy Sullivan. He can be reached at jimdibrookety@aol.com or via phone at 843-685-0543. We can't guarantee transit, but we'll try to help.

530p: If you've signed up, complete your practice round of golf at River Oaks Golf Plantation. Our tee times run from 1215p - 1247p. Please arrive at the course NO LATER THAN 1150a. Since this is in addition to our package, the greens fees are \$29 payable at the course's pro shop. Though we will publish the tee off schedule prior to this date, contact to Jimmy Sullivan if you need more information. He can be reached at jimdibrookety@aol.com or via phone at 843-685-0543. See "6. Driving Directions to Golf Courses & Other Events." For more information on the course, go to www.riveroaksgolfplantation.com.

Starting at 0300p: Check in at the Sea Mist Resort, 1200 S Ocean Blvd, Myrtle Beach, SC 29577 – 843-839-1957. Make sure that you receive your room key, breakfast coupons, and other complimentary coupons. See "2. Resort Check-In Check-List & Rooming List." For more information on the Sea Mist Resort, go to www.myrtlebeachseamist.com.

500p – 600p: Complimentary Oyster Roast at Sea Mist. All golfers staying at the resort are welcome. Remember to bring your coupon for this event. This event is held in the parking lot behind Tena's Restaurant, which is located across Ocean Blvd from our rooms.

OR 500p – ?: Some or many of the practice round golfers are encouraged to stop in at Ron Jon's Beer & Burgers. This joint has received rave reviews by our Assistant Director of Facilities and is located at 3218 Waccamaw Blvd, Myrtle Beach, SC 29579-9451. See "6. Driving Directions to Golf Courses & Other Events." All are welcome, so the driving directions also guide you from the Sea Mist Resort to Ron Jon's.

As early as 600p: Please check the next day's golf information posted to our group's Hospitality room door to see who's on your next day team and when your tee time is.

DAY 1 – Thursday, March 18, 2010 – Callaway Handicap Round at Wicked Stick.

0600a: Complimentary breakfast at Tena's Restaurant starts. It is located across Ocean Blvd from our rooms, next to hotel front office. Make sure to bring one of your breakfast coupons for this. They will not let you in without a coupon.

0715a: Golfers start arriving at Wicked Stick for our Callaway Handicap round of golf. Our first tee time is 0803a and we will be teeing off from both the front and the back. Please see the next day golf information posted the prior evening on the Hospitality Room door for your tee time. Allow 15 to 20 minutes to drive here and check in. See "6. Driving Directions to Golf Courses & Other Events." Make sure that you check your bag in with the course attendants. Captains please check in with Jimmy Sullivan to see if you have an assignment to either place or pickup contest markers. For more information on the course, go to www.wickedstick.com.

0730a SHARP: Mandatory group meeting to be held at or near the Wicked Stick practice green. During this brief session, we'll summarize the schedule, rules, and the like. *We have few mandatory events and this is one.* Thanks for being there early.

0100p-ish: Complete your round of golf at Wicked Stick. Captains please turn your completed scorecard into Dave Buttner, who will be in the clubhouse, immediately after your round.

After Golf: You are free to get back to the resort at your own pace, and enjoy the rest of the day in a manner of your choosing. There will normally be general socializing around our building's pool and hot tub before people head out to dinner.

As early as 600p: Please check the next day's golf information posted to our group's Hospitality room door to see who's on your next day team, when your tee time is, and the time at which you should be checked in with a course attendant. An updated Tote Board should also be posted there for your amusement pleasure. Normally, by this time, there will be a card game or general socializing in the Hospitality room by this time of the evening.

**DAY 2 – Friday, March 19, 2010 – Best Two Scores Round at Indigo Creek > Beers at the Moose (optional)
> Group Dinner at Crabby Mike's.**

0600a: Complimentary breakfast at Tena's Restaurant starts. It is located across Ocean Blvd from our rooms, next to hotel front office. Make sure to bring one of your breakfast coupons for this. They will not let you in without a coupon.

0730a: Golfers start arriving at Indigo Creek for our Best Two Scores round of golf. Our first tee time is 755a and we will be teeing off from the front only this round. Please see the next day golf information posted the prior evening on the Hospitality Room door for your tee time. Allow 20 to 25 minutes to drive here and check in. *See "6. Driving Directions to Golf Courses & Other Events."* Make sure that you check your bag in with the course attendants. Captains please check in with Jimmy Sullivan to see if you have an assignment to either place or pickup contest markers. For more information on the course, go to www.indigocreekgolfclub.com.

0100p-ish: Complete your round of golf at Indigo Creek. Captains please turn your completed scorecard into Dave Buttner, who will be in the clubhouse, immediately after your round.

0200p – 0440p: Group gathering at Moose Lodge. Allow 5 to 10 minutes to drive here from the golf course. *See "6. Driving Directions to Golf Courses & Other Events."* This is strictly a social event and is not mandatory. However, if the scoring information is ready, this is likely where we Day 3 Captains will choose their team for the next day. If there are any scoring complications, the Day 3 draft will occur at approximately 800p back at the resort in the group's Hospitality Room. *Please see the 4. Tournament Format so that you clearly understand changes in the draft process. These changes were also highlighted in 1. Welcome Golfers.*

0500p: Group dinner at Crabby Mike's. Allow about 15 minutes to drive here from the golf course. *See "6. Driving Directions to Golf Courses & Other Events."* This is also strictly a social event, and you've already paid for it. It is really the only "mandatory" social event. So, please come and join the group. See driving directions for how to get the restaurant from the Moose Lodge. These directions also list the restaurant's street address if you are coming here from a different starting point.

After Dinner: You are free to get back to the resort at your own pace, and enjoy the rest of the evening in a manner of your choosing. As noted above, if there are any scoring complications, the Day 3 draft will occur at approximately 800p back at the resort in the group's Hospitality Room.

As early as 900p: Please check the next day's golf information posted to our group's Hospitality room door to see who's on your next day team, when your tee time is, and the time at which you should be checked in with a course attendant. An updated Tote Board should also be posted there for your amusement pleasure. Normally, by this time, there will be a card game or general socializing in the Hospitality room by this time of the evening.

DAY 3 – Saturday, March 20, 2010 – Captain's Choice Round at Barefoot (Norman) Resort.

0600a: Complimentary breakfast at Tena's Restaurant starts. It is located across Ocean Blvd from our rooms, next to hotel front office. Make sure to bring one of your breakfast coupons for this. They will not let you in without a coupon.

0700a: Golfers start arriving at Barefoot (Norman) Resort for our Captain's Choice round of golf. Our first tee time is 732a and we will be teeing off from the front only this round. Please see the next day golf information posted the prior evening on the Hospitality Room door for your tee time. Allow 30 to 40 minutes to drive here and check in. See "6. Driving Directions to Golf Courses & Other Events." Make sure that you check your bag in with the course attendants. Captains please check in with Jimmy Sullivan to see if you have an assignment to either place or pickup contest markers. For more information on the course, go to www.barefootgolf.com.

1230p-ish: Complete your round of golf at Barefoot Norman. Captains please turn your completed scorecard into Dave Buttner, who will be in the clubhouse, immediately after your round.

After Golf: You are free to get back to the resort at your own pace, and enjoy the rest of the day in a manner of your choosing. There will normally be general socializing around our building's pool and hot tub before people head out to dinner. Please note that many of the regulars go to Myabi's Japanese restaurant about 0500p. If you're interested, please talk to Aron Stefanides or Jimmy Sullivan.

As early as 600p: Please check the next day's golf information posted to our group's Hospitality room door to see who's on your next day team, when your tee time is, and the time at which you should be checked in with a course attendant. An updated Tote Board should also be posted there for your amusement pleasure. Normally, by this time, there will be a card game or general socializing in the Hospitality room by this time of the evening.

Sometime before your head hits the pillow: *We'd suggest that you pack and organize yourself this evening.* You may be a bit fatigued this point, and thus may wish to get to bed a little earlier on this last evening. We have an early round of golf on Sunday, and you need to allow time getting out of your room in the morning, getting your breakfast, and then getting to the golf course timely. Leaving it all till the morning is a tactical error that has befallen many before you... You will be toasty by this point and may wish to not stay

DAY 4 – Sunday, May 21, 2010 – Resort Checkout > Tournament Handicap Round at Arrowhead Country Club > Final Meeting & Awards Ceremony > Everybody Travel Home Safely.

0600a: Complimentary breakfast at Tena's Restaurant starts. It is located across Ocean Blvd from our rooms, next to hotel front office. Make sure to bring one of your breakfast coupons for this. They will not let you in without a coupon. GET TO BREAKFAST EARLY THIS DAY. YOU STILL HAVE TO MOVE OUT OF YOUR ROOM & CHECK-OUT...

NO LATER THAN 0710a: Be checked-out of your room and on your way to the golf course. Allow at least 15 minutes for check out, as there will be a line. That means being in the check-out line before 0700a. Clearly, if you are staying an extra night, you do not need to check out. That said, you may wish to confirm that the resort front desk has you in fact assigned to stay an extra night and that your room key card will work when you get back. (For some reason, they never seem to get this right.)

0735a: Golfers start arriving at Arrowhead Country Club for our Tournament Handicap round of golf. Our first tee time is 0806a and we will be teeing off from the front only this round. Please see the next day golf information posted the prior evening on the Hospitality Room door for your tee time. Allow 20 to 30 minutes to drive here and check in. See "6. Driving Directions to Golf Courses & Other Events." Make sure that you check your bag in with the course attendants. Captains please check in with Jimmy Sullivan to see if you have an assignment to either place or pickup contest markers. For more information on the course, go to www.arrowheadcc.com.

0100p-ish: Complete your round of golf at Arrowhead. Captains please turn your completed scorecard into Dave Buttner, who will be in the clubhouse, immediately after your round.

After Golf: We will quickly wrap-up all tournament scoring. Then, there will be a brief awards ceremony in the clubhouse. After the ceremony, you are all free to get safely back to your homes and families. Hopefully, you will have had a great time.

However, since this is a travel day, this grouping approach may not be followed.
Scoring System	The Stefanides Invitational Golf Management System (SIGMS) automatically calculates all scores, analyzes all tie breaker events, awards points, & does not make mistakes. SIGMS also performs automatically performs the draft used to construct Day 2 & Day 4 teams.			

4. Tournament Format (Cont'd)

Callaway Handicap System - Explanation

Under the Callaway system, a player's handicap is determined after the round by deducting from his 18-hole gross score scores from his worst individual holes during the first 16 holes. The table below shows the number of "worst holes" score he may deduct and the adjustment to be made, based on his gross score. The objective is to create some parity in a group of golfers with a wide range of skills. Inconsistent golfers – which would make up a large segment of our tournament population – truly benefit from this system.

How does this work? If a golfer has an 18-hole gross score of 96, he turns to the table and opposite that score finds that he may deduct the total for his three worst holes scored on holes 1 through 16 inclusive. Thus, if he has one score of 9, one score of 8 and a score of a 7, his handicap totals 24. From this total handicap amount of 24, a plus or minus adjustment is then made according to the stroke adjustment at the bottom of each column. For a gross score of 96, the adjustment requires a deduction of 2, resulting in a final handicap of 22. Thus, 96 minus a 22 handicap will yield a net score of 74.

Please note that our Stefanides Golf Management System (SIGMS) does all of this complicated scoring of this automatically. If you're bored though, you can give it try.

Notes: 1. No hole may be scored at more than twice its par. This is a rule that is unique to our Tournament.

2. Half strokes count as a whole. They are rounded UP.

3. The 17th and 18th holes *played* are never deducted. If we are teeing off with golfers going off on the front and back simultaneously, the Tournament Committee will decide if there will be an exception to this rule. If there will be an exception, the committee will announce it BEFORE the start of the round. If you hear nothing before the start, there is NO exception.

5. Tournament Rules.

Please read and follow the tournament rules. This will help everyone feel that they have a fair chance and otherwise enjoy the experience. If you have any questions on the rules or the interpretation of the rules, please Dave Buttner - Assistant Director for Finance / Scoring / Rulings.

1. **Big Picture Rule:** Life is way too short, so let's enjoy the golf, socializing, and camaraderie. We are here to have fun. If any other rule below gets confusing or annoying, please refer back to this rule.
2. **Be Kind to Your Tournament Committee (BE ON TIME) Rule:** The tee times sheet posted each night will clearly instruct your team on what is the latest time they may arrive at the course and be checked-in with a course attendant. *Be at the golf course on time each and every day.* Your doing so ensures that the tournament committee can enjoy their day of golf and not have it turn into a hassle before it starts. "On time" means being ready for the golf course attendant to load your clubs onto your cart *at least 20 minutes (30 minutes on Day 1) prior to your assigned tee time.* Please be ready to head to your first tee right after you are mounted up on your cart. Please see the event schedule for Day 1 of the tournament, when you are expected to be at the course 30 minutes before the group's very first tee time. Being on-time also means neither being in the clubhouse nor at the driving range when your group is instructed to head out to your first tee. Not this will need to apply to anyone, but any individual who is late – relative to the 20 or 30 minutes before tee time requirement – *will receive no tournament points for that day of golf.* Since we're here to have fun, and doo-doo happens, even penalized players will surely not care too much.
3. **Timely Information Rule:** At the end of each round, team captains must immediately turn in their neat and complete scorecards to Dave Buttner - Assistant Director for Finance / Scoring / Rulings. Dave will post the tee times, team captains, and team members on the door of our group's Hospitality Room no later than 600pm prior to the day of play. Dave doing his job timely and your reading what he posts timely, will keep us all timely. The tote board will also be updated and posted daily by the same deadline. On Friday, Dave will likely not post to the door until 800p or 900p because of the group dinner that evening.
4. **Seniors Rule:** Golfers 60 years of age or older may use the senior tees. All others must use the white tees. You can choose to be a manly-man and not do this, but think about your teammates when sorting out your personal testosterone surge. (Even manly-man Frank Tupper has been known to forgo the pride thing and move up to the senior tees for the good of his team...)
5. **Scorecard Rule:** All score cards should be accurate and legible. They should be submitted to Dave Buttner - Assistant Director for Finance / Scoring / Rulings *immediately* after you finish playing your 18th hole. Late, incomplete, or illegible scores will be disqualified and zero points awarded to the whole foursome.
6. **Mulligan Rule:** Everyone gets one Mulligan – from the tee box only – on each nine holes during each round. The player must declare that he is using the Mulligan and he must use that ball no matter of its result. Exception: A player may declare a Provisional Mulligan if there is a doubt if the first tee shot is out of bounds. If a Provisional Mulligan is declared, and if the first shot is in bounds, the player must play the first shot – no matter what the result of the Provisional Mulligan. Note that Mulligans do not carry over from the front nine to the back nine or from one day until the next. We do hope that you play well enough that you do not need to use any Mulligans for the entire tournament. *Note: You cannot use your Mulligan to win a prize for the longest drive or for closest to the pin. Your first shot is the one that counts for any prize event.* (Bottom line: If you're in play and there's water nearby, greed can be bad...)
7. **Gimmee Putts Rule:** *No gimmee putts!* ALL putts must be holed out. No exceptions. If you can't make a 2-foot putt, laugh or curse into your golf towel, and then grab another beer. (If you do the towel thing, be careful when borrowing a golf towel from Jim Heil...)

8. **Casual Atmosphere Rule:** A player may move his ball anywhere on the golf course up to one club length (improve a lie-winter rules) – except when in a sand trap, in a water hazard, on the green. If the ball is out of bounds, you cannot move the ball a club length so that it is back in bounds. This is meant to give a proper lie without improving the general playing conditions. You cannot move the ball from the rough to the fairway nor move it from the fringe to the green, etc. Special note: if your ball is in any kind of standing water in a trap, you may move the ball within to a playable area within that trap. (We also no longer employ the Harmon rule so you cannot move the ball on the green one club length closer to / or into the hole...)
9. **Out of Bounds Rule:** All out of bounds shots incur a one-stroke penalty from the spot that the ball went out of bounds or into the water. This means that if you hit a ball into the water or out of bounds from the tee or fairway, you go to the spot nearest to the spot that the ball went into the water or out of bounds and drop a ball at that spot adding one stroke to your score. Please help keep a steady pace of play. (Laser sighting the point of your ball's unfortunate exit fairway boundaries is not required. Just don't get too greedy about where you drop your OB ball...)
10. **Personal Mercy Rule:** No more than double par score should be placed on the official score card. You may complete the hole if you wish and keep your personal score for your own record, but in the tournament scoring system, no player should score over double par on any hole. This means on a par 72 course...the highest possible score is 144. Please help keep a steady pace of play.
11. **Jim Sullivan Rule:** This states that there is no looking more than 3 minutes for any lost ball. Just leave it for someone else to find, and grab another beer while you're back at your cart snagging the next golf ball that you will likely lose, scuff, or soon relegate to your shag bag. Please help keep a steady pace of play.
12. **Captain's Choice Day Rule:** On Captain's choice day, we always start on the White tees, except for seniors who start from the Senior tees. If course conditions require it, a tournament official may advise of a different standard tee position BEFORE THE START OF THE ROUND. Also, note that the team's score for a hole is completed when any ball is holed out. We will NO LONGER adjust tee position after birdies, bogeys, or whatever. Just remembering one tee position is challenging enough for most of us.
13. **Uneven Number of Golfers Rule:** We always strive to 4-somes, but sometimes last-minute golfer cancellations and additions screw up the best laid plans. So, if we have a total number of golfers that is not evenly divisible by 4, there will likely be one or more 3-somes. In the Best Two Scores and the Captain's Choice Rounds team play matters. Thus, the 3-somes will be allocated such that the middle group(s) end up in a 3-some. For example, if we have 7 teams, the 4th team will be a 3-some if we need to have just one 3-some. Using this same example, if we needed two 3-somes, then the 3rd and 4th teams would have 3 golfers. The logic for this pre-dates the current tournament committee, but it seems kind of logical. WHEN YOU ARE ON A 3-SOME: In the Best Two Scores Round, a 3-some only has 3 guys from which to generate their two best scores. During the Captain's Choice Round, a 3-some team is allowed to take an extra shot from each selected ball location (e.g. tee box, green). PLEASE NOTE that his extra shot must be in a successive rotation – where each guy takes the missing golfer's extra swing *in a set order – with the Captain going first on the first tee played*. For example, on the 3-some's first tee of the day, the captain will hit his tee shot, and then he will hit the missing golfer's tee shot. At the team's second ball location on that first hole, the next person in the extra swing rotation swings for himself and then for the missing golfer, and so on throughout the rest of the round. The extra swing rotation can NOT change once it is set (i.e., you can't take your biggest hitter and always let him hit all of your extra tee shots, or have your best putter get to always putt twice). No skipping turns.
14. **It Ain't Over Till It's Over Rule:** Any player not completing a round will forfeit their score and receive zero points for the day. If you're late, and your team has left without you, you will have an incomplete round. If for some strange reason this does not happen, see rule #2. And, if you are upset about this unfortunate outcome, please see rule #1. Please just be on time, and don't party so much that you can't finish your round. There's always plenty of time in the afternoon and evening for partying.

6. Driving Directions to Golf Courses & Other Events.

These directions are straight from Google Maps. If you are uncomfortable with this approach, please use your own method. Destination addresses are all listed below, so you can plug them into your own GPS system or ask a stranger standing on the street. Phone numbers are also provided to help bail you out, if needed. Please allow plenty of time in order to be on time for every group event. Thanks.

Notes:
